A wide range of social movements arose across the U.S. from 1890-1920, known as the “progressive era”. The women’s suffrage movement was a part of this wave, culminating in the passage of the 19th Amendment – giving women the right to vote -- on August 18, 1920 – 100 years ago this year. How did the “progressive era” impact women in their communities, including your ancestors?
